**Here's Some
 Code:**

Counter Tops 101 - The NYS residential building code requires at least one receptacle outlet on each island and peninsula counter space over 24 inches by 12 inches in kitchens, dining rooms and similar areas. The code does allow the receptacle to be below the counter top providing it is within 12 inches of the counter top. These receptacles cannot be below the counter top if the counter top overhang is 6 inches or more. If there isn't any side on the counter with less than a 6 inch overhang then the receptacle has to be installed above the counter top but cannot be installed facing up. Receptacles cannot be installed inside a cabinet below the counter top. These receptacles must be on a 20amp small appliance circuit and GFCI protected. RCNYS E3801 NEC 210.52 (C).

DID PANEL #17 MAKE THE RIGHT CHOICE?

The change in question pertains to GFI protection for electrically heated floors in bathroom, hydromassage bath tub, spa, and hot tub locations. A proposal was submitted by Phil Simmons to revise Article 424.44 (G) "Ground fault circuit interrupter protection for heated floors of bathrooms, and in hydromassage bath tubs, spas and hot tub locations. The proposal was in two parts. First was to remove "for heated floors of bathrooms and in hydromassage bath tub, spa and hot tub locations" from the title. This part of the proposal was accepted by the code panel. The FPN which was the second part of the proposal which the panel chose not to accept, which myself and the submitter felt would provide valuable information for the user of the NEC. The FPN read "FPN: see 680.27 (C) (3) for restrictions on the installations of radiant heating cables for spas and hot tubs installed outdoors". The panel justified the deletion of the FPN in the panel statement. They felt 680.42 outdoor locations and 680.43 indoor locations states that provisions of Part II of this article shall apply. In Part II 680.27 (C) (3) does not permit radiant heating cables in or below the deck, hence the deletion of the wording and the FPN is in order. So, here's where you come in, we would like to hear from you if you think the FPN should have been accepted or not, or maybe an even more detailed FPN is needed. Write us, let's see maybe a proposal for the 2008 Code is in order.
